Pioneer tale of a close-knit Danish family chronicles the ripple effect of the many heartbreaking decisions they make on their 1,300-mile trek to Utah Territory, pulling a handcart and seeking an American Zion.

The newly released historical novel *Upon Destiny's Song* co-written by Mike Ericksen and Sage Steadman is based on the true-life story of Ole and Ane Madsen, who with their children left their native Denmark in 1856 to answer the call of early leaders of their religion, The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

After docking in New York City, with two-thirds of a vast continent still lying before them, they signed on to the Willie Company, one of ten pioneer companies that helped travelers without horses or wagons make the long trek to Utah Territory on foot. Packing a company handcart with their meager belongings and pulling it all the way, they set out.

Upon Destiny's Song details how the family's already arduous challenge took a harrowing turn when oxen were lost, food ran out, and harsh winter storms descended. Still hundreds of miles from their destination, they huddled together on the crest of Wyoming's Rocky Ridge. Starving and freezing, say Ericksen and Steadman, the Madsens made brave choices that collectively reflected "the true meaning of faith, sacrifice, and family."

Interspersed throughout *Upon Destiny's Song* are Ericksen's reflections of how his ancestors' story parallels his own life. He comments, "I was so moved by their sacrifice and courage that I felt their story deserved to be told. Because of the selfless acts of my great-great-grandfather Ole Madsen, my great-grandmother Marie lived to become a thread in the tapestry of Sanpete County in central Utah – and in our own lives."
